# Fiscal Year July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023 Highlights "A Picture is Worth a Thousand Words"

The Friend Historical Society (FHS) formed in 2007, is a 501(c)(3) non-profit and owns the Warren Building-Opera House which in 1988 was listed on the National Register of Historic Places. In 1885 and still today the first-floor houses businesses and the second floor Opera House. The first floor features the original 1920's Hardware Store fixtures.

FHS Mission: 1) **PROVIDE** a community gathering place in the historic Warren Building, 2) **PURSUE** diverse educational, historical, and cultural experiences and 3) **PRODUCE** economic benefit by MAKING FRIEND AN INVITING PLACE!

The Historical Society hosted 12 events which included educational, historical and cultural events.

The Friend Historical Society had 60 members. A member Messenger Group provided communication about upcoming events and activities. The dues helped upgrade the lighting in the San Carlo Room/Welcome Center.

Space was rented to the Pour House Bistro, Edward Jones Office, and the San Carlo Room/Welcome Center rentals provided space for 15 private events. With reasonable pricing, these rentals included birthday parties, anniversaries, family reunions, graduation parties, meetings, etc.

#### Other Revenue Sources:

- Donations, grants, QCDs, gifts of grain, and estate gifts have provided building renovations.
- Local funds of over \$1,300,000 have supported the first-floor renovation and continued structural repairs.
- The NE Dept. of Economic Development Shovel Ready Grant with local match funded new brick, cap flashing, helix ties, tuck pointing, north foundation repair, steel beam under the Welcome Center, etc. State reimbursement was made.
- CDAA tax credits funded approved Historic Renovation projects.
- The Saline County Visitors Bureau & Norris Public Power grants provided partial funding for advertising and lighting in
  the San Carlo/Welcome Center, the Ne State Historical Society Foundation helped support the Ray Page video which
  describes Friend's most famous citizen who, in 2021, received NE Legislature recognition for his 1920's contributions to
  aviation history. His Lincoln Standard Aircraft Company and Flying School taught Charles Lindbergh how to fly.

### 2023-2024 Next Steps

The Opera House renovation next step is adding an addition on the southside of the Warren Building to provide an elevator for accessibility to the Opera House. The addition includes a catering kitchen and a mechanical room for Opera House HVAC/sprinkler system needs.


